

# Trygstad misses deadline

## Duffy: no resort

PALMER — At 5:01 p.m. Wednesday the final, extended deadline passed for Victor Trygstad to supply information on his proposed Homestead Resort. Trygstad didn't show.

Consequently, Mat-Su Borough Planning Director John Duffy released a statement saying

he will ask the Planning Commission at its meeting Monday night to object to the reclassification and sale of the 320-acre borough parcel Trygstad wanted to acquire for a resort site in the Butte.

That would almost certainly kill the project. The assembly could still review the measure and vote contrary to the Planning Commission's recommendation. Trygstad

could not be reached for comment.

The Homestead Resort proposal has met rigorous opposition along the way, beginning with a unanimous vote against the project by the Butte Community Council.

Other groups, including the Wasilla and Palmer chambers of commerce, endorsed the plan.

But public testimony at each Planning Commission hearing ran heavily against. The commission postponed action a number of times because of insufficient information, or, in one case, Trygstad's absence due to illness.
